- 1. Judges is the 7<sup>th</sup> Book in the Bible, in the Old Testament. It is called Judges because the people who led Israel were called Judges. God was Israel's King in the days before Israel had human kings also.
- 2. According to tradition, Samuel wrote the Book of Judges.
- 3. Judges covers the years from approximately 1380 BC to 1043 BC.
- 4. The cycle in Judges that was repeated is that of sin, bondage, repentance, deliverance, and peace. This national cycle is repeated throughout the Book of Judges. It is also repeated throughout all of our lives.
  - a. Sin: we do something wrong against God and/or another person
  - b. Bondage: our sin has consequences
  - c. Repentance: we confess our sins to God and/or apologize to the other person that we have affected by our actions
  - d. Deliverance: we are free from the control of the sin
  - e. Peace: God gives us peace because He forgives us, and we don't have to be afraid or ashamed of anything anymore
