



Could the Babe Born in Bethlehem be the Long Awaited Messiah, King of the Jews?

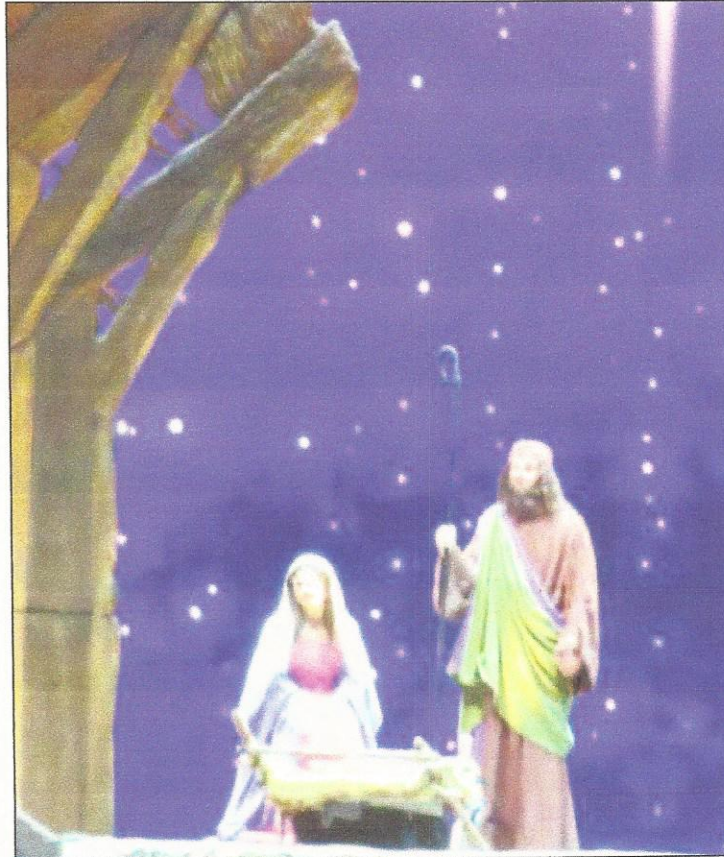
"Yet out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be Ruler in Israel" (Micah 5:2)

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, Though you are little among the thousands of Judah, Yet out of you shall come forth to Me The One to be Ruler in Israel, Whose goings forth are from of old, From everlasting." Therefore He shall give them up, Until the time that she who is in labor has given birth; Then the remnant of His brethren Shall return to the children of Israel. And He shall stand and feed His flock In the strength of the LORD, In the majesty of the name of the LORD His God; And they shall abide, For now He shall be great To the ends of the earth; And this One shall be peace" (Micah 5:2-5).

Consider this particular prophecy from Micah, one of many in the Scriptures.

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah." There are two Bethlehem's in Israel, one in Galilee in the tribal inheritance of Zebulun (Joshua 19:15), and the other in Judah near Bethel. It was near Bethlehem, also called Ephrathah, that Rachel died in giving birth to Benjamin (Genesis 35:16-20). This Bethlehem was the setting for the Book of Ruth (Ruth 1:2). It is also the ancestral home of David (1 Samuel

16:4-13). This Jesus of Nazareth, who was born this day, is a direct descendant of David, and has likewise been born in Bethlehem in Judah. Bethlehem means "House of Bread." The name of the place

itself conjures up thoughts of the manna which God provided for our fathers in the wilderness (Exodus 16). Here is an interesting thought. Perhaps this Jesus, born in the "House of Bread" is Himself,

spiritually speaking, "Bread of Life."

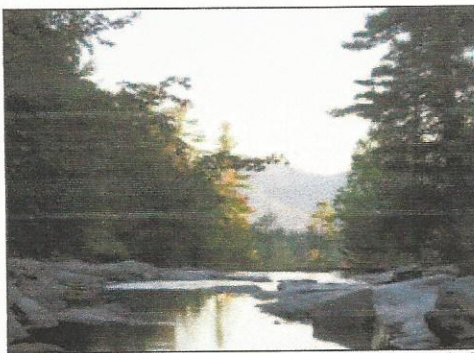

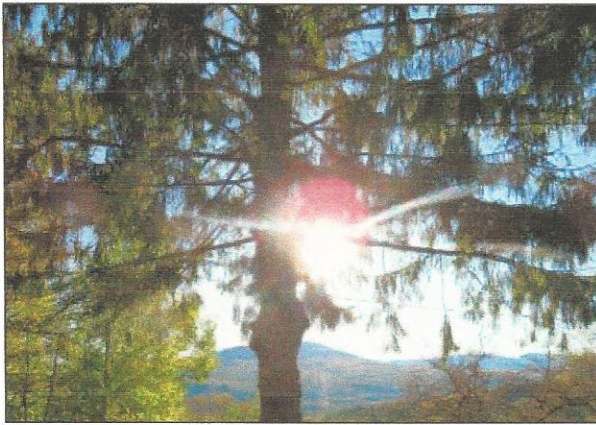

Heli: "Anna, let us patiently prepare, but yes, this is the best news yet! The Consolation of Israel has come! We are so blessed, thanks be to God."

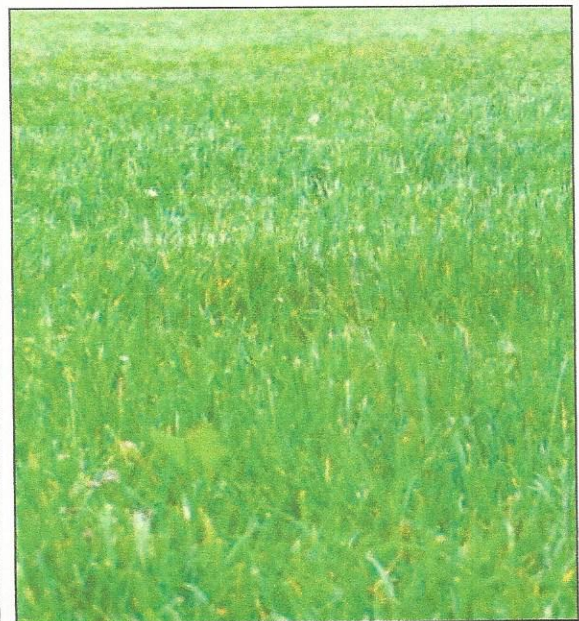
Elizabeth: "Zack, Zack! We just got a message from Heli and Anna. The Babe, Jesus, has been born! May we travel to see Him?"

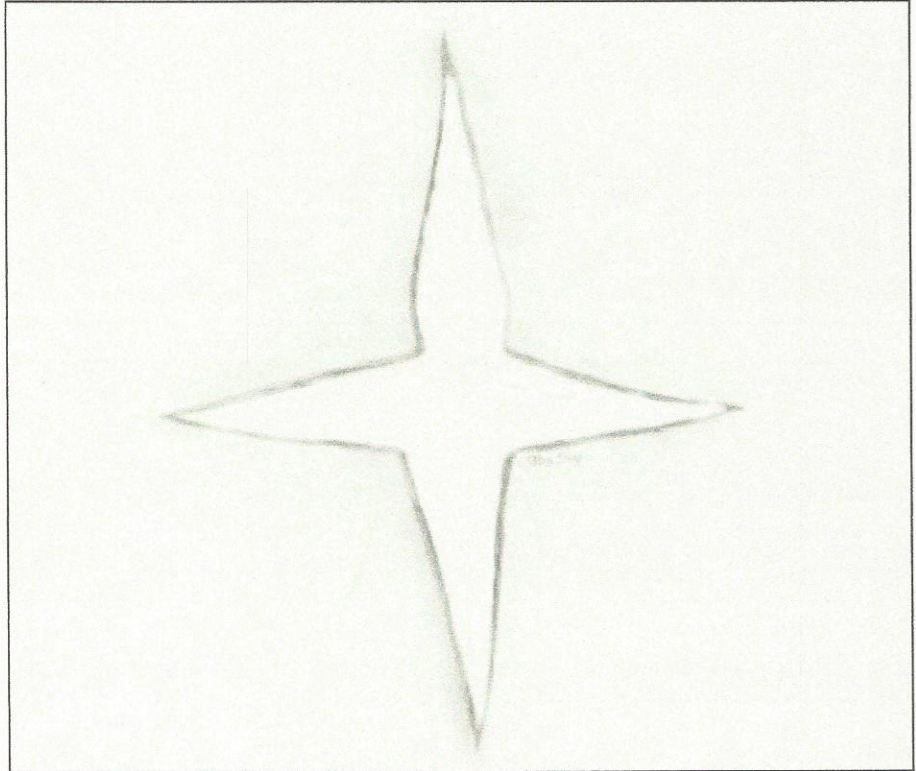

"Though you are little among the thousands of Judah." The Messiah of Israel shall be born in a town that is relatively obscure in its day. What are the odds?

"Yet out of you shall come forth to Me The One to be Ruler in Israel." He who would be born of a virgin in mean circumstances would grow up to one day become the King of Israel (Isaiah 7:14, 53:2).

"Whose goings forth are from of old, From everlasting." This is fascinating! This affirms that the Messiah, the Christ, will not only become incarnate as Man, but that He is also God! By definition, only God is eternal, so this is obvious from Micah's writings. Agur writes, "Who has established all the ends of the earth? What is His name, and what is His Son's name, If you know?" (Proverbs 30:4). The Creator of the Universe has eternally co-existed with the God-Man, who is also identified as the Son of God. This is a title that everyone knows is reserved for the Messiah. Many think that they know His name, Jesus, which means "God Saves."

"Therefore He shall give them up, Until the time that she who is in labor has given birth; Then the remnant of His brethren Shall return to the children of Israel." This is a difficult verse to understand.

"Had rained down manna on them to eat, And given them the bread of heaven" (Psalm 78:24)

Micah seems to imply that Israel will reject her Messiah as a nation, and be allowed to go her own way. This has been the pattern of history, as we see in the Books of Kings and Chronicles. However, God is not through with His nation Israel, which is the 'apple of His eye' (Deuteronomy 32:10). There will always be a remnant of faithful Israel, both ethnically and spiritually. One day, God will cause believing Israel to be regathered in peace as one. Taken with passages such as Isaiah 53, this teaches that there will be a successful ministry of Messiah, then He will be put to death, then He will one day return in what we might call a "Second Advent." Perhaps when these events happen He will usher in the "New Covenant" that God speak of in Jeremiah 31:31-34, when sin is forgiven and forgotten once and for all on the basis of Christ's work.

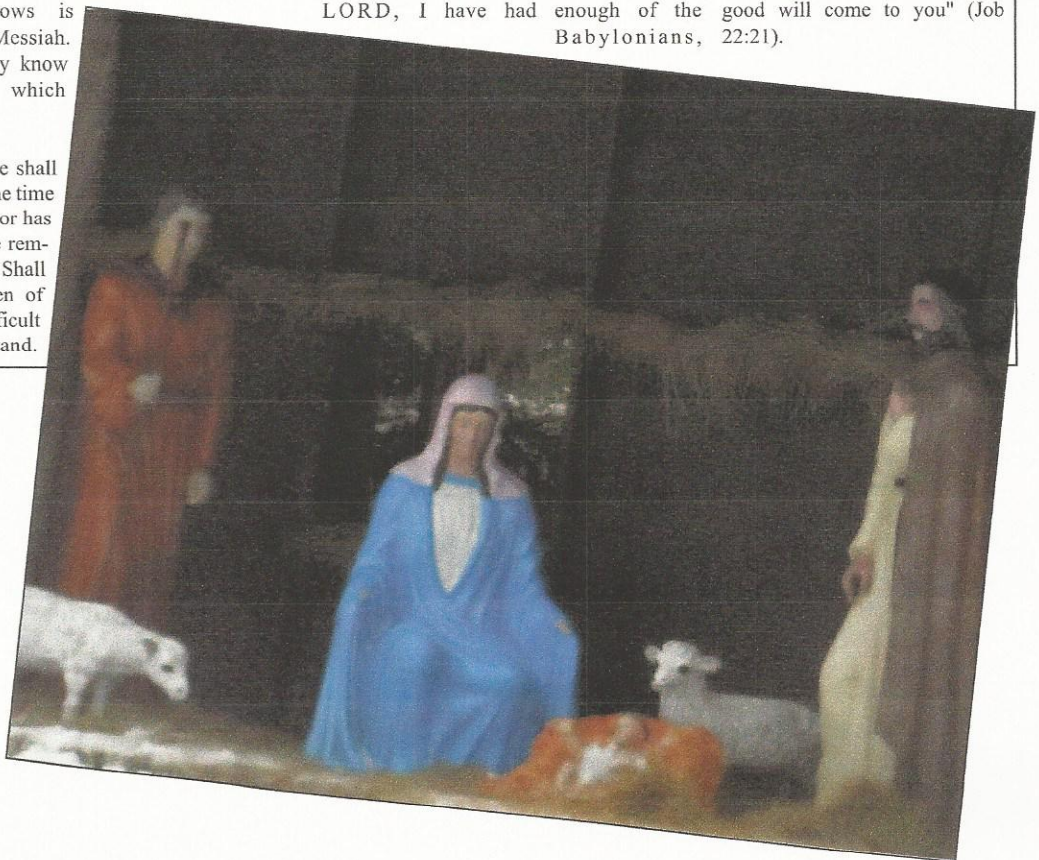
"And He shall stand and feed His flock In the strength of the LORD,

In the majesty of the name of the LORD His God." Ezekiel tells us that God is the True Shepherd, the Good Shepherd, and the Great Shepherd (Ezekiel 34:11-15). Apparently, there will be one flock, fed by the Messiah. This flock will consist of Jews and Gentiles, men and women, slaves and freedmen. The Messiah, who we might call "The Good Shepherd," will feed, protect, and nurture His people with every blessing. What a thing to look forward to, and I dare pray that you and I experience a measure of this even now, as many affirm (and as I study Micah's prophecy I become more and more convinced) that Jesus born in Bethlehem is the Hope of Israel and of all nations (Genesis 12:3).

"And they shall abide, For now He shall be great To the ends of the earth." Oh, to abide with God in a world of perfect rule and justice! The kingdoms of this world will give way to the Kingdom of God and His Christ! I have had enough of the Babylonians,

Persians, Greeks, and Romans, and shall rejoice in the Kingdom which shall never disappoint and never end (Daniel 2:37-44).

"And this One shall be peace." The shepherds have testified that they heard the angels last night saying, "Glory to God in the Highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men." It is through the Christ that we will have peace. Peace on earth He shall bring. "Yes, He shall build the temple of the LORD. He shall bear the glory, And shall sit and rule on His throne; So He shall be a priest on His throne, And the counsel of peace shall be between them both" (Zechariah 6:13). But now, God has provided this day the way of peace, through His Son Jesus. Having completed this article, there is no more doubt in my mind. Jesus is the Christ. I shall resolve to learn more of Him each and every day. Reader, I urge you, to follow this counsel, "Now acquaint yourself with Him, and be at peace; Thereby good will come to you" (Job 22:21).



The Genealogy of Joseph of Nazareth: The Messiah could Legally be his Descendant

Among the qualifications for one to be the long awaited Hope of Israel is His genealogy. Most importantly, Messiah must be a descendant of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and David. The right to the throne of Israel is at stake, so it is most important to ensure that we get this right. The legal right is hereby established according to the following genealogy of Joseph, as meticulously kept by the scribes through the centuries. The one difficulty that arises, however, is with regard to Jeconiah, whose descendants are excluded from the throne, according to Jeremiah 22:30. We conclude then that Jesus of Nazareth would be disqualified

if Joseph was Jesus' actual biological father. However, the testimony we have received is that Mary was not impregnated by Joseph, but was in fact with Child by God the Holy Spirit, fulfilling the prophecy in Isaiah 7:14. And by her genealogy,

Here is the genealogy of Joseph:

"Abraham begot Isaac, Isaac begot Jacob, and Jacob begot Judah and his brothers. Judah begot Perez and Zerah by Tamar, Perez begot Hezron, and Hezron begot Ram. Ram

"Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel."

(Isaiah 7:14)

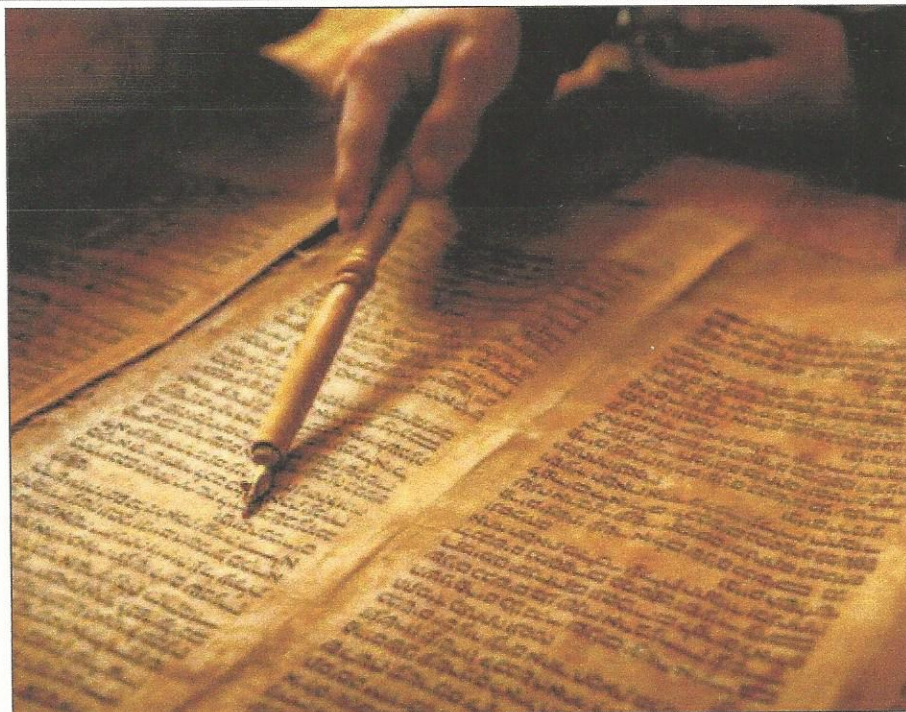
begot Amminadab, Amminadab begot Nahshon, and Nahshon begot Salmon, Salmon begot Boaz by Rahab, Boaz begot Obed by Ruth, Obed begot Jesse, and Jesse begot David the king. David the king begot Solomon by her who had been the wife of Uriah. Solomon begot Rehoboam, Rehoboam begot Abijah, and Abijah begot Asa.

Asa begot Jehoshaphat, Jehoshaphat begot Joram, and Joram begot Uzziah. Uzziah begot Jotham, Jotham begot Ahaz, and Ahaz begot Hezekiah. Hezekiah begot Manasseh, Manasseh begot Amon, and Amon begot Josiah. Josiah begot Jeconiah and his brothers about the time they were carried away to Babylon. And after they were brought to Babylon, Jeconiah begot Shealtiel, and Shealtiel begot Zerubbabel. Zerubbabel begot Abiud, Abiud begot Eliakim, and Eliakim begot Azor. Azor begot Zadok, Zadok begot Achim, and Achim begot Eliud. Eliud begot Eleazar, Elcazar begot Matthan, and Matthan begot Jacob. And Jacob begot Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus who is called Christ."

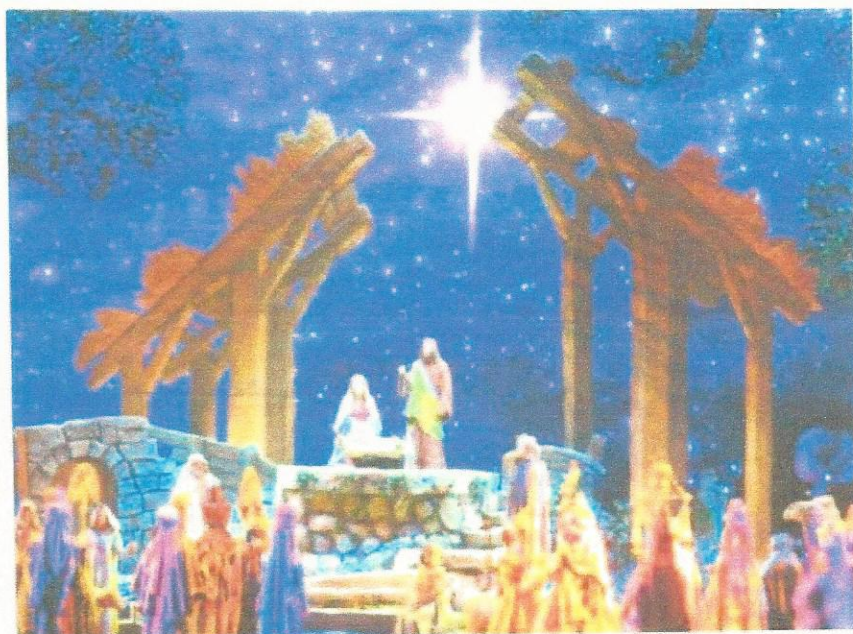
