Eyewitness Interview of Mary Magdalene!

"I was having the most mournful day of my life, and with a heavy heart, I headed out. Two days ago, the Romans crucified Jesus, my Savior, It was a very unnerving scene that I sadly can't seem to dis-remember. "They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him," I blurted out, with hints of anxiety creening into my of anxiety creeping into my voice. The disciples glanced at each other. The look was so fast that I could have missed it entirely. Then, in unison, they stood up and bolted for the door. They ran and ran until they had reached Jesus' tomb. A couple seconds later, I arrived, my chest heaving, longing for air. Scattered inside the tomb were linen cloths. Peter's friend noticed them first, but never entered the tomb. Then Peter noticed, and I watched his eyes widen. Both of them just stood there for a few minutes, trying to decipher what they were see-


Mary the Mother of Jesus of Nazareth Shares Her Thoughts


Jacob the Benjamite

Because of his deeds, even by his own admission, Jacob deserved to die. In the end, however, he placed his faith in Jesus of Nazareth as his Savior and Messiah. Jonathan of Bethany

Jonathan of Bethany, 32, was found guilty of murder and treason against the Roman authorities, and put to death Friday. His family has requested that their names not be included in this notice, either for fear of arrest, or because of the bad name that he had brought on the family through the years. Jonathan has become both a hero and laughingstock among the locals because of his continual mocking of Jesus of Nazareth even as he was also crucified with him. He was buried in an ancient family tomb just outside Bethany. A service was held Friday evening in his memory, but nobody attended.



Judas Iscariot

Judas Iscariot, 33, of Kerioth, Judah, died Friday just outside Jerusalem city limits of self inflicted wounds. He was the treasurer of the group of men who accompanied Jesus of Nazareth, who also died that day. Judas has no known family. Since nobody claimed his body, and he had no family tomb, Judas was buried in the field which was bought with his money for thirty pieces of silver.

According to custom, during the Passover Feast, the Roman governor pardons one criminal who is condemned to death. This year, a man named Barabbas, who was found guilty of committing murder in the insurrection, received pardon. This happened in the most extraordinary

The Trials of Jesus of Nazareth: A Transcript

"Then the detachment of troops and the captain and the officers of the Jews arrested Jesus and bound Him. And they led Him away to Annas first, for he was the father-inlaw of Caiaphas who was high priest that year. Now it as Caiaphas who advised the Jews that it was expedient that one man should die for the people. The high priest then asked Jesus about His disciples and His doctrine. Jesus answered him, "I spoke openly to the world. I always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where the Jews always meet, and in secret I have said nothing. Why do you ask Me? Ask those who have heard Me what I said to them. Indeed they know what

And when He had said these things, one of the officers who stood by struck Jesus with the palm of his hand, saying, "Do You answer the high priest like that?" Jesus answered him, "If I have spoken evil, bear witness of the evil; but if well, why do you strike Me?" Then Annas sent Him bound to Caiaphas the high priest.

Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas to the Praetorium, and it was early morning. But they themselves did not go into the Praetorium, lest they should be defiled, but that they might eat the Passover. Pilate then went out to them and said, "What accusation do you bring against this Man?" They answered and said to him, "If He were not an evildoer, we would not have delivered Him up to you."

"You take Him and judge
Him according to your law."
Therefore the Jews said to
him, "It is not lawful for us
to put anyone to death," that
the saying of Jesus might be
fulfilled which He spoke, signifying by what death He

Then Pilate entered the Praetorium again, called Jesus, and said to Him, "Are You the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered him, "Are you speaking for yourself about this, or did others tell you this concerning Me?" Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have delivered You to me. What have You done?"

Jesus answered, "My king-

dom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight, so that I should not be delivered to the Jews; but now My kingdom is not from here."

Pilate therefore said to Him, "Are You a king then?" Jesus answered, "You say rightly that I am a king. For this cause I was born, and for this cause I have come into the world, that I should bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice."

Pilate said to Him, "What is truth?" And when he had said this, he went out again to the Jews, and said to them, "I find no fault in Him at all." "But you have a custom that I should release someone to you at the Passover. Do you therefore want me to release to you the King of the Jews?" Then they all cried again, saying, "Not this Man, but Barabbas!" Now Barabbas was a robber.

So then Pilate took Jesus and scourged Him. And the soldiers twisted a crown of thorns and put it on His head, and they put on Him a purple robe. Then they said, "Hail, King of the Jews!" And they struck Him with their hands.

Pilate then went out again, and said to them, "Behold, I am bringing Him out to you, that you may know that I find no fault in Him."

Then Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. And Pilate said to them, "Behold the Man!"

Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying,

they cried out, saying, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "You take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him." The Jews answered him, "We

The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to our law He ought to die, because He made Himself the Son of God."

Therefore, when Pilate heard that saying, he was the more afraid, and went again into the Practorium, and said to Jesus, "Where are You from?" But Jesus gave him no answer.

Then Pilate said to Him. "Are

You not speaking to me? Do You not know that I have power to crucify You, and power to release You?" Jesus answered, "You could have no power at all against Me unless it had been given you from above. Therefore the one who delivered Me to

you has the greater sin."
From then on Pilate sought to release Him, but the Jews cried out, saying, "If you let this Man go, you are not Caesar's friend. Whoever makes himself a king speaks against Caesar."

When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the judgment seat in a place that is called The Pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the Preparation Day of the Passover, and about the sixth hour. And he said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" But they cried out, "Away with Him, away with Him! Crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered,

Tensions arose, however, because of reports that Senator Ericus has now indicated that he believes in the resurrection of the dead, something that the




Above: An Artist's Portrait of the rocky coastline at Rosh HaNikra in Northern Israel

All those who go down to the dust


Shall bow before Him.
