“And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what *is* that good and acceptable and perfect will of God” (Romans 12:2).

"The grass withers, the flower fades, But the word of our God stands forever" (Isaiah 40:8).

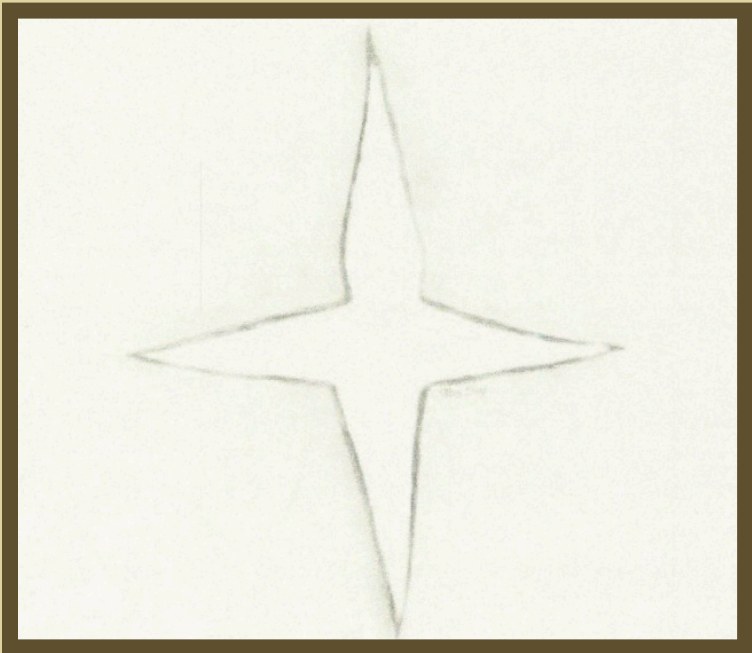
After much research and study of the Tanakh, we have **great news** to announce.

HANUKKAH CELEBRATION IN FULL SWING!

Chanukah, the “Feast of Dedication”, in remembrance of the rededication of the temple in the days of the Maccabees (165 BC, on 25 Chislev), is in full swing. This feast is associated with lights, and sometimes called the Feast of Lights. The historical book of 1 Maccabees 4:52-59 (RSV) gives us the historical narrative of that history which was written of in advance by the prophet Daniel (Daniel 8:9, 11:28-35).

“Early in the morning on the twenty-fifth day of the ninth month, which is the month of Chislev, in the one hundred and forty-eighth year, they rose and offered sacrifice, as the law directs, on the new altar of burnt offering which they had built. At the very season and on the very day that the Gentiles had profaned it, it was dedicated with songs and harps and lutes and cymbals. All the people fell on their faces and worshiped and blessed Heaven, who had prospered them. So they celebrated the dedication of the altar for eight days, and offered burnt offerings with gladness; they offered a sacrifice of deliverance and praise. They decorated the front of the temple with golden crowns and small shields; they restored the gates and the chambers for the priests, and furnished them with doors. There was very great gladness among the people, and the reproach of the Gentiles was removed. “Then Judas and his brothers and all the assembly of Israel determined that every year at that season the days of dedication of the altar should be observed with gladness and joy for eight days, beginning with the twenty-fifth day of the month of Chislev.”

Come up to Jerusalem and join us as we rejoice at the deliverance that Adonai has accomplished, and look forward to His future deliverance to be accomplished by Messiah!

Do You Desire Liberty or Tyranny?

“Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty” (2 Corinthians 3:17). Where is the Spirit of the Lord more evident than in the place where God-fearing Christians are? “You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men. You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. When the church begins to look like the world, it becomes ineffective, and the devil is well pleased with that. When you hear the terms misinformation and disinformation, think thought police. When good becomes evil, and evil becomes good, and people accept it en masse, we are heading for tyranny and divine judgment (Isaiah 5:20). The misnamed ‘Respect for Marriage Act’ is an act that disrespects God’s perfect design for that institution (Genesis 2:24). We do not oppose interracial marriage between one man and one woman. It is the marriage between people of the same sex that we oppose, on biblical grounds. The provision about interracial marriage was added by liberal politicians in order to cloud the issue and as a political move so that the supporters of the act could falsely claim that opponents to the act are both homophobic and racist. Are You Really a Christian Disciple?

Christian, have you put much stock in your discipleship? “For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also” (Matthew 6:21). The foundation which we stand on was laid by Christ Jesus. “When the whirlwind passes by, the wicked is no more, But the righteous has an everlasting foundation” (Proverbs 10:25). So now what do we do, after the foundation has been laid? “Walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God” (Colossians 1:10). No longer pleasing yourself, growing daily to be more Christ-like, and pleasing Him comes from our knowledge of the Scriptures. The Holy Bible—Read it and know God.

Lastly, if you do not want people to mock you, do not be like the church at Ephesus in the Book of Revelation. “Nevertheless I have this against you, that you have left your first love” (Revelation 2:4).
