
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The Providence of God in History By Eric Correia

America is not the same as the elect nation of Israel (Exodus 4:22). However, the USA has made herself a client nation of God by virtue of appealing to the Living God from her foundation. #### Christian Versus Humanistic Philosophy of Education By Brian Chevalier

The difference between the two can be broken down in three areas: (1) Purpose of Education, (2) Content of Education, (3) Control of Education. (1) Purpose of Education from the Christian standpoint is primarily as a benefit to God and student. It promotes learning to be Christ-like. "For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren" (Romans 8:29). As Christians, we are commanded to teach our children the good news. "Train up a child in the way he should go, And when he is old he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6). "And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4). The humanistic view is that "the state" public school system is primarily a benefit to the state, as it instructs the student to behave, obey, and learn to submit to the government. A former Superintendent of Public Instruction for the State of Pennsylvania states "if the welfare of society and the state depends upon an educated citizenry, and if the state possesses the legal authority to tax the property of all its citizens for the accomplishment of this result, then the state must also possess and must exercise the authority to compel the children who are to become its future citizens, and upon whom its welfare in the future depends, to attend upon the instruction provided for them" (Encyclopedia Americana, 1954, Volume 9, Page 601).

(2) Content of education as a Christian views it is traditional education like reading, writing, and arithmetic, but it also goes deeper, learning the Bible approach. As Christ said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). As for the humanistic view of the public school system, their education content consists of varying degrees of traditional and progressive education. Traditional education involves the structured approach of disciplined learning of factual knowledge, including reading, writing, and arithmetic. But its progressive education also involves socialization and pragmatism, based on the idea that the truth is constantly changing, and that there are no absolutes. "Beware lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and empty deceit, according to the tradition of men..." (Colossians 2:8, Continued on Page 6)

#### The Church at Smyrna: Materially Poor but Spiritually Rich By Cheryl Correia

In the Book of Revelation, the Church at Smyrna was characterized by faithful believers. Persecution and prejudice surrounded these followers of Christ. This church was praised by Jesus, and not condemned. Although its people were both socially and economically marginalized by Jews and Gentiles, these believers were materially poor but spiritually rich. Although they were shut out of the trade guilds, they would not be shut out of heaven. Revelation 2:9- "I know your works, tribulation, and poverty (but you are rich); and I know the blasphemy of those who say they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan." The church at Smyrna can be associated with the period of church history from 100-313 AD. It was during this time period that the faithful follower Polycarp, who ministered in Smyrna, was martyred. Around 156 AD, he was boiled in oil and burned at the stake.

An interesting application for believers involves the faithfulness of the church at Smyrna. Even now in America, there is soft persecution towards those who are Bible-believing and are truly living for Christ. We must persevere and overcome any prejudice or persecution because of our faith in Jesus. Another application is to pray for those churches and people who are facing persecution. We should also desire to speak about Jesus while we lawfully still can in our country. Lastly, and most challenging, we should always pray, do good, and bless the persecutors.

There is a warning to those who persecute God's elect, whether knowingly or unknowingly, since they are doing the work of the devil. Revelation 2:10-"Do not fear any of those things which you are about to suffer. Indeed, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested, and you will have tribulation ten days. Be faithful unto death, and I will give you the crown of life." The biblical warning is meant for people to question whose side they are on. Currently in the USA, this church lives on in Bible-believing churches experiencing soft persecution. #### 'Debt Free', (Proverbs 22:7) By James Moriello

"The rich rules over the poor, And the borrower is servant to the lender." (Proverbs 22:7, NKJV)

First, the temporal application. We have always had rich and poor, and a private market lending (i.e. banking) system is something that was present even in Bible days. "The borrower is servant to the lender" as long as there is an outstanding debt. The existence of debt puts pressures and stresses in our lives that should not exist, and would not exist, if only we lived within our means. Yet for so many, the covetous spirit causes a living outside the means, and the end is misery. The material things do not satisfy, and the relationships suffer. So pay off your debts as quickly as you are able by stopping the spending. In these days, even in the midst of uncertain times, financial windfalls come. Maybe they come in the form of tax refunds, government stimulus checks, additional unemployment compensation or severance pay, front line hazard pay, overtime (if you are lucky enough to be very busy working), or an inheritance. If these things come, free yourself from being "servant to the lender" by using them to pay off debt, rather than to indulge desires. It is fashionable today to expect the government or some family member to pay one's self-incurred debts, and to default. This kind of thing happened a few years back when underwater home owners simply refused to pay their mortgages. This scofflaw behavior is horrible testimony when the Christian does it, excepting some real medical or family emergency. Let us be honest. Most people put themselves in such situations. Christian, get out of it by paying your debts. Do not seek to find ways to avoid paying what you promised, but pay your debts gladly and promptly.

Second, the spiritual application, relating to spiritual debts that we owe to God, and to one another. The Bible teaches, "Owe no one anything except to love one another" (Romans 13:8). And in the context of God's love, love is not a debt to be begrudged, but a debt that we pay freely. Has Christ Jesus not set us free from our sin debt, although He owed us nothing but what we earned, a just payment of spiritual death? "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23). Indeed, we are indebted to Christ, because He paid the sin debt we could not pay, so let us serve Him forever.

#### Pergamos: The Compromising Church, By B.B. Johns

Pergamos, the compromising church, is aptly named, being "thoroughly married" to the culture. In it, the church and state were inseparable. Through Emperor Constantine's adoption of Christianity, the Roman Empire merged into the Roman Catholic Church. The city of Pergamos was a center of many pagan cults including emperor worship, goddess worship, and worship of the whole Greek pantheon of gods. Considered an intellectual center of the ancient world, it was more Gentile populated than Jew-ish. The Pergamos Church history era is between 313 and 600 AD. The church established here consisted of mostly worldly Gentiles. This church is not different from most American churches that carry on some semblance of Christianity, but are wrapped in sins of worldly pursuits. Hence Jesus' bitter words and judgment to the church. "I know thy works, and where thou dwellest, even where Satan's seat is" (Revelation 2:13, KJV). He is omniscient. There is nothing hidden from Him. Our thoughts, intentions, and doings are naked before His eyes. The make-believe Christians within the church who make works more valuable than faith and the truth of the doctrine of salvation are in darkness, and darkness is Satan's domain. The Lord's opening statement in Revelation 2:12, "He which hath the sharp sword with two edges", is a very strong statement denoting severe judgment and readiness to mete out punishment. The Pergamos Church was commended for not denying the divine truth. "Thou has not denied my faith" (Revelation 2:13). Yet the Lord condemned the Nicolaitans within the church who do hypocritical works by which the worship of God is defiled. To the unrepentant, the Lord promises quick retribution (Romans 2:8-9). The Lord is intolerant of immoral behavior and false-teaching works of Nicolaitans and Balaamites.

#### Thyatira: The Corrupt Church, By Scott Lanctot

Thyatira means "continual sacrifice." The city was founded by Alexander the Great, and it was a city famous for its colored

dyes. The description of this church fits the prevailing Christendom of the years 600 to 1517 AD. False doctrine prevailed. Lay people were forbidden to read the Bible. Only the priests were allowed to. The church was corrupt and in darkness of unsound doctrine, hence the term "Dark Ages." Today in the USA, if you are Christians, and you do not have a Bible and read it, shame on you. How are we to know the truth if we do not read God's Word? 1 John 5:19- "We know that we are of God, and the whole world lies under the sway of the wicked one." Satan is happy when we don't follow God's commands, knowing that we are apt to falter and sin. Let us do our Bible Study and our homework, and be disciplined in our discipleship, that we may know the truth from error, and make life corrections. We must guard against false teachings. John 1:17- "For the Law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ." His Word cut straight, if followed, will prevent you from stumbling. We appeal to the promise of God, that He is "not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). If that's not a plea from God, I don't know what is.

"...according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ"

(3) Control of education in the humanistic view sees public education as something which the state must regulate and control. Familiar terms like mandatory school attendance, teaching credentials (state licensing of teachers, authorizing them as qualified teachers), and minimum standards come to mind. As for the Christian view, God gives parents the responsibility of educating their children for Himself. The parents have been given control of the child's education. The parents may choose to put their child under the tutorship of a church-related school, an independent Christian school, or they may choose to teach the child from the home.

The education today that is taught according to the humanistic philosophy of education is very liberal. In some cases, students learn to even hate themselves. Too often "real history" is not being taught, as history is twisted to fit the desired narrative. The humanists even teach that God does not exist, and some even come across as hating anyone who worships God or has religious beliefs.

Here the unity of the human race is clearly stated. All nations are humankind under one Father (in the universal sense). Has not one God created us and controlled our history providentially? "Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10). A nation should pray to the Lord to reveal His will. "For a good tree does not bear bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For men do not gather figs from thorns, nor do they gather grapes from a bramble bush. A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil. For out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks" (Luke 6:43-45). A nation failing to educate itself in providential history will see a rise in secularism. Whether or not a nation cultivates a relationship with God will be shown by its fruit.

"And now for a little while grace has been shown from the LORD our God, to leave us a remnant to escape, and to give us a peg in His holy place, that our God may enlighten our eyes and give us a measure of revival in our bondage" (Ezra 9:8). The period of the Babylonian captivity had ended for Israel, and many of the captives were returning to Jerusalem. Ezra the priest was tasked with setting these folks on a good spiritual track as they arrived. The children of Israel had received grace, unmerited favor, and a second chance. God always preserves His remnant of those of true faith in Him, and so He did in this instance. The imagery of "a peg in His holy place" is one of a nail in the wall, a place to hang something up. We use the expression of our homes as "a place to hang our hat." There may even be another place that you often visit where there is a spot for you to hang up you coat as you arrive for a nice visit with friends and loved ones. When someone hangs up their coat as they arrive "in His holy place", there are two results. First, "that our God may enlighten our eyes." A time of deep prayer and Bible reading and study will alert us to the blessed reality of spiritual truth. Having the sin nature still within us, we are still in that sense "in our bondage." But there is spiritual freedom with Christ Jesus. "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). We surely receive "a measure of revival" from knowing Him and being in His presence. The world can be a scary and uncertain place. But the believer always has "a peg in His holy place." There is a place to go, and a God to go to, when we are groaning under the weight of the trials of this life. God awaits you there, at the door of prayer. Right now.

Editor's Notes: This is a very interesting, challenging, and though provoking article. There are a few Christian teachers left in our public schools, but they are wildly outnumbered. Humanistic progressive educators must be held to account. Parents need to pay attention to what their children are being taught, and take an active role in their children's education. God must be left in, not left out.

#### The Life and Legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., By James Moriello

Dr. King (1929-1968) was a visionary, a man of peace, and a social justice warrior. But first and foremost, he was a Christian Pastor. While I neither agree with nor endorse many of his theological beliefs, this man was truly used by God in his time. Dr. King's thinking was informed by several Christian Bible principles, chief among them being the inherent dignity of all men and women as beings made in the image of God (Genesis 1:26-27, NKJV), love of neighbor as oneself (Leviticus 19:18), and Sermon on the Mount principles of nonviolent resistance and love of enemies (Matthew 5:38-48). We begin with some big picture background of the circumstances that led up to the days of Dr. King and the civil rights movement that he led.

Historically, racism in America has largely been along the lines of skin color. It had its origins in the African slave trade. Both Europeans and Africans were complicit in taking human beings captive and selling them across the Atlantic. Under the Law of Moses, such a thing to the extent that kidnapping was involved, was punishable by death (Exodus 21:16).

Let us now acknowledge two basic Bible truths. First, all people have equal access to salvation spiritually through Christ Jesus (Galatians 3:28-29). This teaches us the high intrinsic value of every soul, for Christ's blood was shed for all peoples (1 John 2:2). The second Bible truth is found in Acts 17:26. "And He has made from one blood every nation of men to dwell on all the face of the earth, and has determined their preappointed times and the boundaries of their dwellings." There is one human race. We are all descendants of Adam and Noah. There are therefore no distinctions based on color or ethnicity, with regard to the value of each person.

The following principles may be derived from the "I Have A Dream" speech by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on 8/28/1963. The commentary is my own.

1. Dr. King saw his movement as the greatest demonstration in US History. But we recall that the greatest demonstration in all of history was that of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ to save sinners such as we (Romans 5:8).

2. Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863. This remedied the lack of human dignity ascribed under the law. But things were much different in practice. Dr. King drew applications from spiritual captivity and applied them to the circumstances in the nation. Just as spiritual captivity was remedied by the coming of the Lord (Luke 4:18), physical captivity is remedied by application of true justice according to Christian principles. See Matthew 6:10.

3. The occasion of this speech is within the context of lawful redress of grievances. This is always the first and best option. But after a century, Dr. King and supporters of the movement for equality of civil rights regarding skin color were not going away. They would neither be intimidated nor give up.

4. Dr. King spoke well of our founding documents. Their basis in Judeo-Christianity was amenable to Dr. King. Human rights were seen by him to be "unalienable", having been gifted to men by the Creator God, and not by the whims of a godless government. His concept of liberty is a similar concept to annotations noted in point 2 in connection with Luke 4:18.

5. "Riches of freedom and the security of justice" are concepts essential to the nature of God, and freely offered by Him. Dr. King's use of "God's children" should, in this context, be applied in the universal sense, and not the special sense of believers only.

6. "For what credit is it if, when you are beaten for your faults, you take it patiently?" (1 Peter 2:20a). Dr. King endorsed peaceful means only. Sadly, others who claim to be in the mission of Dr. King have co-opted the movement and committed excesses and crimes. This happened in the 1960's and it continues to this day.

7. "But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God" (1 Peter 2:20b). Dr. King's call for "meeting physical force with soul force" reminds us of the conduct of Jesus Christ when He was arrested at the Garden of Gethsemane, put on trial, and crucified on the cross. It was Dr. King's earnest desire that the movement "not lead us to a distrust of all white people." Yet this is exactly what today's Critical Race Theory does, and it is being promoted in our universities and workplaces today. Dr. King says that "we cannot walk alone." This is what is taught in the Bible in Ecclesiastes 4:8-12.

8. God is no respecter of persons. "For there is no partiality with God" (Romans 2:11). The preacher quotes Amos 5:24, which reads, "But let justice run down like water, And righteousness like a mighty stream" (Amos 5:24).

9. Dr. King shared the Christian belief that "unearned suffering is redemptive." Christ's suffering was redemptive.

10. Perhaps the best known line of Dr. King's speech is this: "I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character." This criteria for judgment is color-blindness. Character is important, especially Christian character, above all other traits. Affirmative Action was signed into law by JFK in 1961 as a means to prevent discrimination. Today, it is often used to establish quotas according to race, gender, or other class, and results in unfairly treating those who are not of that class. This is contrary to the spirit of Dr. King's statement.

Furthermore, such interpretation and practice foments more division of various groups, races, and classes.

11. The orator interjected into his speech a marvelous and hope filled quote from Isaiah 40:4-5: "I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, every hill and mountain shall be made low, the rough places will be made plain, and the crooked places will be made straight, and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together."

12. We find five words stressed by Dr. King. Hope. Faith. Brotherhood. Prayer. Freedom. All enjoined in the Bible.

13. "Free at last! free at last! thank God Almighty, we are free at last!" Let us pray as we have been taught by the Lord, "Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10). May divine principles relating to the essential thing, Christian salvation, be operative in our great nation. "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free. Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed" (John 8:32,36)

We have come a long way to asserting the human dignity of all men and women of all races. What now should the church do? Preach the gospel and seek to live out the Great Commission. Respect others, assert human dignity, and promote justice according to Christian principles, but do not encourage people to think of themselves as victims of injustice without cause, nor excuse those who choose sinful lifestyles. May we all humbly think of ourselves as recipients of divine love, grace, and mercy! And know this: Christ came to save sinners (1 Timothy 1:15), not to achieve social justice. When we preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and not social justice, we shall have greater effect in the world for Christ. Social justice has its place as an outworking of the gospel, but it cannot be achieved without the conversion of the human heart through the hearing and believing in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
