Daily Devotional, January 8, 2021

"Be Angry, And do not Sin", (Psalm 4:4, NKJV)

"Be angry, and do not sin. Meditate within your heart on your bed, and be still. Selah Offer the sacrifices of righteousness, And put your trust in the LORD." (Psalm 4:4)

The nation mourns today over yesterday's events which occurred at the Capitol in Washington DC. Unruly individuals engaged in criminal behavior there, which is never acceptable. It remains to be seen who these folks in DC were, whether they were supporters of the President, opportunists, or enemies of the President planted there for a purpose. Criminal behavior is not acceptable in DC, in Portland, Seattle, Providence, Minneapolis, or anywhere else as a means to seek redress for a grievance.
