"Lawlessness", (2 Thessalonians 2:7, NKJV)

"For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only He who now restrains will do so until He is taken out of the way." (2 Thessalonians 2:7)

Whether or not certain injustices and crimes have been committed should "be determined in the lawful assembly" (Acts 19:39). "Let all things be done decently and in order" (1 Corinthians 14:40). Notwithstanding these truths which accord with the nation's Judeo-Christian heritage and foundation of law, "lawlessness" has become the stated goal of some in our nation.
