"Peace, Goodwill Toward Men", (Luke 2:14, NKJV)

"Glory to God in the highest,

And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"" (Luke 2:14)

This was the angelic announcement regarding the entrance of the Savior into the world. It was written of the Christ, "And this One shall be peace" (Micah 5:5). It was the manifestation of the "goodwill" of God to offer salvation to the children of men. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). No matter how trying the circumstances around you, Jesus is your hope, if you will consider Him. Henry Wadsworth Longfellow penned the following poem on Christmas Day in 1863, during the days of the Civil War. Some have set it to music and sung it as a ballad of praise.
