Daily Devotional, September 16, 2020

'Spiritual Pilgrimage', (Psalm 84:5-7)

"Blessed is the man whose strength is in You, Whose heart is set on pilgrimage. As they pass through the Valley of Baca, They make it a spring; The rain also covers it with pools. They go from strength to strength; Each one appears before God in Zion." (Psalm 84:5-7, NKJV)

The spiritual pilgrimage begins the moment the sinner is saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. The pilgrim goes on God's strength, crying out in prayer and saying, "Strengthen me according to Your word" (Psalm 119:28). To this the Lord replies, "Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41:10). The pilgrim has a renewed heart which is set for the journey at hand (Ezekiel 36:26). "For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Philippians 3:20).

The Christian life is a passing through this world to the eternal home in the next. As we journey, we seek God's purpose in our lives. Our Savior prays for us, saying, "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth. As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world" (John 17:17-18). Much of this earthly odyssey is a passing "through the Valley of Baca." It is the valley of weeping over sin's results and life's travails. But take heart, for "His favor is for life; Weeping may endure for a night, But joy comes in the morning" (Psalm 30:5).

As we continue the journey, the pilgrim goes "from strength to strength." Those who stay on the straight path become stronger in the Lord as they become more like Him. "Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:12-14). One day, at last, it is written of everyone who embarks on spiritual pilgrimage, "Each one appears before God in Zion."
